

LETTER FROM OUR PRINCIPAL



One year ago many people would not have recognized much of what we do in schools today; masks, social distancing within the classroom, the abandonment of the idea of sharing being important, and temperatures being taken before entry into the building each day. All new elements of the school environment! However, our students and families have adapted well to the changes we have had to make to ensure student attendance on a daily basis.

The only positive about the longer break is that it did allow for us to accomplish a great deal within the buildings. Javier and Ricky were able to get a lot of stripping and waxing done in both buildings, all areas cleaned thoroughly, and repairs made where necessary. A number of projects were completed and a big thank you goes out to Jerry O'Neil, Mark Croy, and Rob Kelsey for helping with some painting at the North Campus. We were also able to get the railing installed on the window well at the North Campus, as well as the rear stairwell of the

She has been employed at DACC teaching GED classes for several years. And finally, we welcome aboard Kerry Showers as our North Campus administrative assistant. She is also teaching a Media Science class and coaching girl's tennis. Kerry's husband and children all attended Schlarman. A couple of other changes to report are that Mark Croy has resumed some of the Religion teaching at the North Campus and Katie Coulter has taken over as the assistant principal for both campuses. It is wonderful to have the people we have. All of our staff is dedicated, talented and good role models for our kids.

Schlarman did see two retirements this past year. Pat Prall retired after 44 years of teaching including 29 years of teaching religion at Schlarman. She was really looking forward to spending some time with her grandchildren. The other retirement was that of Pat Stitt. Mrs. Stitt has been a fixture in the office of Schlarman for 50 years. She is also a 1952 graduate of Schlarman High School. Both of these women are not only devoted to Schlarman, but are classy individuals who are truly an inspiration to many kids both past and present. We thank them greatly for their support and service to the Schlarman family.



Celebrating 75 Ofears



The concept of a Catholic high school in Vermilion County began at the end of World War II, when the pastors from the Catholic churches in Danville and Westville began discussions. These men appealed to the Bishop for permission to establish the school, it was granted and the search for a site began. While the latter endeavor was undertaken, it was decided that the first high school class would begin the freshman year in a specially prepared area of St. Patrick's Grade School in September of 1945 with 39 students. It was named Central Catholic High School.



The Most Reverend J.H. Schlarman, D.D. Bishop of Peoria

In July of 1945 Monsignor Cleary had quietly begun making inquiries about purchasing the W. G. Hartshorn Estate, also known as Greystone, for the new site for the high school. With the Bishop's approval of the Hartshorn site and with generous contributions and pledges from local people and businesses, plans were formulated for the purchase of the estate. The price was stated in the local paper to be more than \$40,000.00, also purchased was an additional five acres, which gave the school frontage on Lake Vermilion. On the day of the purchase announcement, the property was officially named Schlarman High School in honor of the Most Rev. Joseph H.

Schlarman, then Bishop of the Diocese of Peoria. At the public announcement Bishop Schlarman said, "the Catholic High School will be dedicated as a living memorial to all the Catholic men and women of the Danville and Westville areas who have served and fought in World War II."

On the morning of September 16, 1946, students, priests and local parish members gathered on the front lawn for a Pontifical Low Mass celebrated by Bishop Schlarman that opened Schlarman High School in its present location. Following the mass students were registered, the enrollment for freshman and sophomores totaled over 100. Shortly after the new school year began in 1946 ground was broken for a new classroom wing, construction continued during the entire school term.

On March 2, 1947, the official blessing and laying of the cornerstone by Most. Rev. Bishop Joseph H. Schlarman for Schlarman High School was held in ankle deep snow. During the ceremony the bishop thanked all those for their teamwork to make it possible to open the school in such a short period. He noted the urgency necessary to combat Communist influences in America and the necessity of providing sound moral foundations for the lives of youth. He said, "Some people seem to think they can build a big nation on nothing more solid than the idea that a child must develop its own personality and must not be taught any principles of religion or morality in its youth. How can one expect these poor children to respect the Ten Commandments when they never heard of them in school or home? The school and home reach every child. No church can reach every child."



1947-Laying of the Cornerstone



In December of 1947 the very first edition of the school newspaper, The Hilltopper, was published. It got its name from the location of the school - the highest geographical point in Danville. Following this the students and athletic teams became "Hilltoppers." In 1949 the very first yearbook became a reality, it was fittingly name <u>The Summit.</u>

On January 9, 1947, ground was broken for the athletic field west of the school that would bear the name of Monsignor W.J. Drummy. The layout would include a combination football and baseball field, two tennis courts, concrete bleachers and two outdoor basketball courts. The football field was first used for the 1949 season and was formally dedicated on September 25, 1949.

1947-Blessing of Sacred Heart Statue

On May 22, 1947, a Lourdes group of two statues, Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Bernadette were blessed where they had been erected in the rose garden. They were donated by Monsignor F.A. Cleary in honor of his parents. Monsignor Cleary also gave another statue of the Sacred Heart that was on an elevated pedestal on the school's front lawn and was blessed on October 16, 1947. In the fall of 1947 the class enrollments were as follows:44 freshmen, 52 sophomores, 43 juniors for a total of 139 students. At the beginning of the 1948-49 school year the enrollment was over 200 students, housing four classes.

The fall of 1948 Paul Shebby was hired to serve as the athletic director, teach Civics and Physical Education and coach football and basketball, in those capacities he influenced the life of every Hilltopper. Coach Shebby remained with the school until 1967. On June 3, 1949, Schlarman High School saw the first class of graduates accept their diplomas at St. Patrick's Church. Bishop Schlarman gave the commencement address in which he said, "The purpose of Catholic education is to teach students to think, judge and act in a Christian manner everywhere; in the home, in the factory, in public life." -article information taken from Schlarman High School...Its beginning complied by Mary Jane O'Rourke Brady, class of 1949
