

LETTER FROM OUR PRINCIPAL



As I look around Schlarman Academy I see a lot of what I would consider to be positive changes and improvements, but I also see a lot left to do. Many of the changes we have made have been academic while others have been structural, but I feel confident that all have provided some benefits to our students and to the Schlarman Academy families.

Financially, we are as well off as we have been in quite a while. I credit this to a very productive and professional Advancement Office and a number of grants that have provided us some extra money for some building projects and some personnel payments. Some of this money has allowed us to do some roof work on both buildings, fix the plumbing at the South Campus, replace the carpeting at the South Campus, and reseal the parking areas at the North Campus. We are now beginning the process of fixing the structural issues in the mansion area of the North Campus beginning with those most necessary.

Academically, despite being small, we have taken some huge strides forward and much of that is due to the combined efforts of Mark Croy and Janet Picillo, an anonymous donor, and some very cooperative DACC staff. They have recently helped us with a new program called GECC that allows our students to receive as many as 40 hours of college credit while rarely, if ever, leaving our campus. We are very grateful to our donor, DACC officials, Mr. Croy and Mrs. Picillo for their work on this program.

While the school year may not have started out as expected, things are going well. In the last issue I announced that I would be stepping down and Schlarman Academy would have a new principal. As luck would have it, last minute changes took place and I returned as principal for my fourth year. Mark Croy and Barb Rew continue on as my assistants. With retirements and resignations we have welcomed several new faces at both buildings. Tamera Crowder is our new first grade teacher, Susan Andrews is in second grade, Laurie Sermersheim is in third grade, and with an abundance of Kindergartners we have added a second Kindergarten manned by Ann Soderstrom. Monique Cano is our new computer/yearbook instructor, Ann Underwood is teaching the religion and health at the high school, Walter Rongey is teaching the junior high school science and high school biology, Rosi Perez is teaching the high school Spanish program and Cindy Peck has joined as guidance counselor. We also welcome Pamela Murillo and Nancy Moore to our staff this year as teachers in the Title I classroom and we have a new cook at the high school in Alyssa Isernhagen and a new aide at the grade school in Connie Kittell. It has been a pleasure to bring all of these new faces onboard this year.

We were able to have a Homecoming Dance this fall after a year without it due to COVID. Fall activities and sports returned as well and recently we conducted the Topper Classic Basketball Tournament thanks to Jerry O'Neill. We have added a couple of sports in men's and women's tennis and recently had a sophomore, Maya Jenny, qualify for the women's state tournament at the end of October.

None of these improvements and activities would be possible without our wonderful staff, the Advancement Office, our parents, and our generous donors. I am proud of what Schlarman Academy is accomplishing and especially proud of our students who make it all worthwhile. I will keep telling myself that we are not yet a finished product, but we are headed in the right direction.

LETTER FROM OUR ADVANCEMENT DIRECTOR



Dear Alumni and Friends of Schlarman,

One of the questions we are asked most frequently is: 'How is the school doing financially?" We are very happy to report, as Mr. Janesky did in his letter, that we are on solid financial ground. All of this is only possible through the consistent annual giving from alumni and non-alumni who believe in our mission. The Schlarman Advancement Office is the main fund raising arm of Schlarman Academy and over the past four fiscal years has averaged \$670,388.72 in total fundraising a year, totaling \$2,681,554.88. This amount includes annual appeal, grants, scholarship funds including Empower Illinois (Invest in Kids,) estate gifts, golf outing, Topper Shop (FY 21), Schlarman Foundation funds and the spring raffle. Total gift count grew from 119 in FY 18 to 520 in FY 21. The Invest in Kids Tax credit scholarship amount of

\$181,827.00 in FY 21 was the highest in the Diocese, with 39 schools participating.







Schlarman Academy students can now earn up to 38 hours of college level courses without leaving Schlarman Academy North Campus. These courses are taught by faculty from Schlarman Academy and Danville Area Community College and students can earn their General Education Core Certificate (GECC) along with their high school diploma. This certificate ensures that Schlarman students can transfer all their core credits (over a year of college credit) to all state colleges and universities schools as well as Indiana State University. Currently 100% of our senior and junior classes are taking dual enrollment classes. 

SCHLARMAN ALUM PERFORMS IN NYC




