A BETTER EDUCATION



Academic excellence was one of the top three reasons parents reported for choosing Schlarman Academy

- Our student to teacher ratio is 13:1, enabling our teachers to give students focused, individualized attention
- We currently partner DACC to offer the students the possibility of 47 potential college credit opportunities. 25 of those credits are offered by Schlarman faculty in-person on a daily basis in the areas of Accounting, English & Arts/Humanities. All remaining opportunities are offered in a hybrid setting with DACC instructors with Schlarman student only sections.
- Advanced Mathematics curriculum (Algebra I-Middle School, Algebra II, Trigonometry, Calculus-High School)
- Our foreign language instruction begins in kindergarten
- Cursive hand writing instruction
- Accelerated Math and Reading Programs
- Project Kid Tech for South Campus students
- Partners in Art for South Campus with yearly Art and Science Expos

THEY ARE TWICE AS LIKELY TO ATTEND A FOUR YEAR COLLEGE



- Our expanded dual enrollment program will provide high school students the opportunity to graduate with up to 47 college credits without leaving our campus, more than a year of college credit. These dual enrollment classes are currently provided to our students free of charge.
- The opportunity to earn college credits while in high school will significantly lessen the financial burden for Schlarman Academy students and their families as they continue onto the college of their choice.
- Schlarman graduation rate is 100% compared to the national average 84 % and Danville District 118 average of 70%
- Post-secondary education is pursued by 90% of our graduates
- Studies have shown that students at small schools show higher levels of academic interest and educational aspiration than students in larger high schools
- 86.5% of Catholic High School students attend a four -year college compared to 46 % of public school students

THEY WILL HAVE A SAFER LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

THEY WILL BECOME STRONG IN MIND, BODY, SPIRIT



- 76% of our student body is involved in at least one co-curricular activity
- Students at the junior and senior high level participate in community service, high school students are required to complete 100 hours of service
- Schlarman's diverse student body admits students without regard to race, religion, sex, national or ethnic origin
- Students are free to practice their beliefs in a faith-filled environment, together as a school community we pray daily and join for all-school mass monthly
- We provide daily religious instruction, centered on Christian values and the Catholic tradition
- We provide opportunities for our Catholic students to participate at masses by lecturing, singing, or serving
- The development of high moral practices and standards in their children through a faith and values based education is one of the top three reasons parents choose Schlarman Academy.

- Catholic School climate, mission and purpose positively impact student achievement
- The poorer and more-at-risk a student is, the greater the relative achievement gains
- Catholic school students perform better on: voluntary community service, using civic skills, political tolerance and respect for others opinions
- African Americans and Hispanics are more likely to take rigorous classes, graduate on time and attend college
- Catholic schools score at an academic level about 12 months ahead of their public school counterparts
- Achievement gaps between students is smaller in Catholic schools
